The film screening was followed by a brief talk in which the director shared her experiences on making this film and question and answer session. Around 180 guests attended the screening.

Ms. Anila S.K, a development sector professional by career, took to film making a couple of years ago, following her long time passion. She had worked with the government and non-government agencies in and out of Sri Lanka, including the United Nations. Hailing from Kerala, she made her debut film 'Orazhcha' in Malayalam, which was premiered at the Jaffna International film festival in September 2016 and was one of the eight films in competition.
