
renovation of existing buildings; construction of retaining walls around the complex and supply of machinery, equipment, tools, furniture, vehicles, computer software etc.

Mr. Taranjit Singh Sandhu, High Commissioner of India and by Mrs. R. Nadaraspillai, Secretary, Ministry of Hill Country, New Villages, Infrastructure and Community Development. To monitor the implementation of the project, a Project Steering Committee (PSC),



co- chaired by Deputy High Commissioner of India and Secretary, Ministry of Hill Country, New Villages, Infrastructure and Community Development including Representative from the Department of External Resources, the Department of Project Management & Monitoring, Ministry of National Policies and Economic Affairs and from Assistant High Commission of India, Kandy has been constituted.

Beneficiaries: On the completion of this Project, every year 500 youth of Sri Lanka are expected to be trained in vocational streams. Trainings imparted in upgraded TVTC would provide a strong platform for estate community to overcome unemployment problem by exploring jobs in various fields including infrastructure, construction and industrial sector as skilled workers or starting self employment.
